CAN I PRACTISE MY PROFESSION IN ANOTHER EUROPEAN COUNTRY WITH MY DIPLOMA?

As a general rule, an EU citizen can carry out any professional activity in another EU country, subject only to the same rules and limitations as nationals.

Some countries make access to certain activities, which can be either self-employed or employed, subject to the possession of specific degrees, diplomas, certificates or qualifications.

In these cases, it will be necessary to apply for recognition of these for professional purposes before the competent bodies in each host State.

WHERE DO I PAY MY TAXES?

There is no specific EU legislation on taxation, although care must be taken to avoid double taxation of income of persons with income from different countries and non-discrimination against nationals.

You will normally be taxed in the country where you are resident for tax purposes.

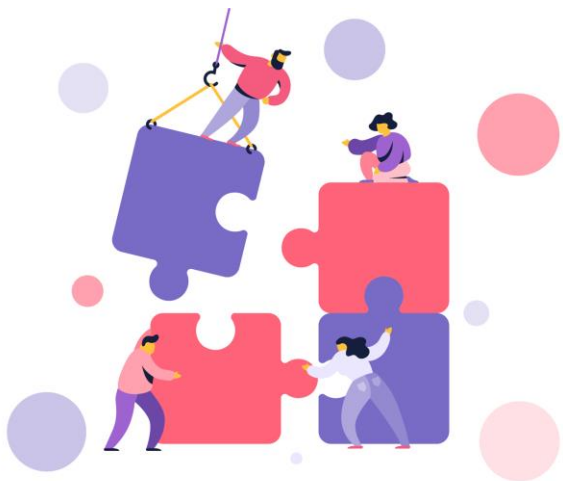

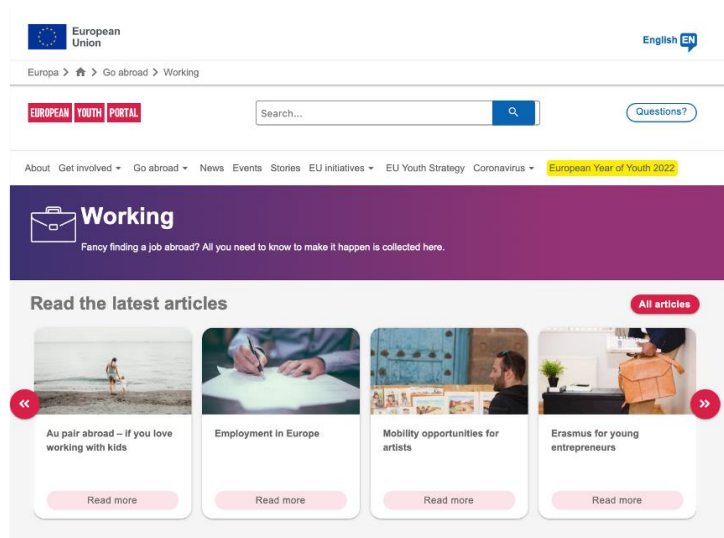

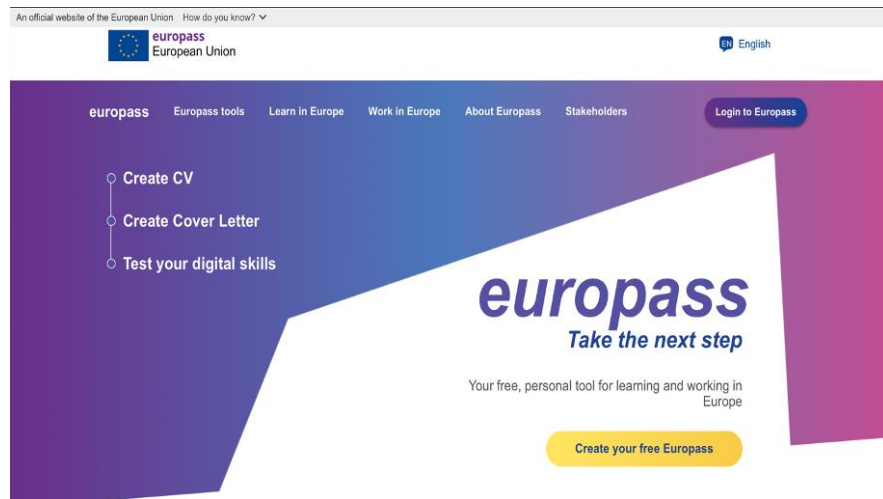
